# 2010 TEXAS REUNION DRAWS NIGH: MORE DETAILS ANNOUNCED

Wells Camp Commander Gary Bray has announced that David T. Eschenfelder will be the featured speaker at the Awards Luncheon on Saturday June 5 at the 2010 Texas State SCV Reunion. Eschenfelder was born and raised in Shreveport. His ancestry is a combination of German, French, Scots-Irish, Spanish, and Caddo Indian. Eschenfelder's lineal and collateral ancestors served as volunteers in the French & Indian War, the American Revolution, the War of 1812, the Mexican War, the War of Northern Aggression (both sides), the Indian Wars, the Spanish American War, World War I, World War II, Korea, and Vietnam. He became fascinated with archaeology at age five upon finding his first arrowhead. Eschenfelder's doctoral dissertation concerns Civil War archeology.

Eschenfelder will be bringing approximately 4000 artifacts to put on display. The relics were dug up from the camps of Texas Confederate troops around Mansfield, Louisiana, and this will be the first time they have been displayed anywhere.

Commander Bray will displaying some his personal Civil War artifacts, and some United Confederate Veteran camp flags that have recently been turned over the SCV by the United Daughters of the Confederacy will be on display also.

SCV National Commander Chuck McMichael will be the speaker on Saturday evening.



### **REAGAN'S SAFE ARRIVES IN TEXAS**

A safe belonging to the Confederate The Order of the Confederate Rose Postmaster General was delivered by truck to Texas on the morning of May 3. John H. Reagan's office safe arrived at the Rolland Safe Company in north Dallas for several weeks of cleaning and restoration before being put on display at the Confederate Museum in Fort Worth.



John Henninger Reagan (October 8, 1818—March 6, 1905), was a leading 19th century American politician from the state of Texas. A Democrat, Reagan resigned from the U.S. House of Representatives when Texas seceded from the Union to join the Confederacy. He served in the cabinet of Jefferson Davis as Postmaster General. After the Confederate defeat, he called for cooperation with the federal government and thus became unpopular, but returned to public office when his predictions of harsh treatment for resistance were proved correct.

The town of Murphy is the home of what once was the largest unmaintained cemetery in Collin County, the Maxwell Cemetery, currently named the Decatur-Maxwell-Murphy Cemetery. Located on the northern edge of Murphy, this cemetery is the final resting place of many of Murphy's earliest settlers, including several Confederate soldiers, with burials dating from 1853 to 1966. The Decatur-Maxwell-Murphy Cemetery contains approximately 3 acres and over 300 graves.

The memorial program starts promptly at 10:00 A.M., and we would like for our troops the get there around nine to help with the setup. If you have a uniform, please wear it. We will probably be firing several salutes, so bring your rifle and powder if you can.
